



2011 Alumni Hall of Fame Inductees



Jack Huxel coached for thirty three years at the Perry Schools and was instrumental in founding three of its programs: Wrestling, Boys Soccer and Girls Soccer. During his outstanding career, Jack coached wrestling, boys' and girls' soccer, football and boys' and girls' track.

Mr. Huxel started the Perry Wrestling program during the '71-72 school year and was the Head Wrestling Coach for ten years. During his tenure, his teams won the GRC League Championship three times ("74, "75, "77) and went undefeated during the '73-74 season. He always stayed very involved in the wrestling program and went on to guide the middle school wrestling team for an additional 16 years.

Coach Huxel was a longtime assistant track coach, having coached the boys' team for 26 years and the girls' team for 24 years. He went on to become the head track coach for both the boys and the girls for three years, in which time his teams compiled at 28-2 record. He coached four District Champions, nine State Qualifiers, six top ten winners at the State Meet, as well as one State Champion.



Elaine (Tikka) Lillback is a 1942 graduate of Perry High School. While she attending Perry, served as a Senior Class officer, was a member of the Glee Club, the Scholarship Club, and received the Silver award. A lifelong learner, Elaine attended The Ohio

State University, Judson College, Bowling Green State University, Lake Erie College, Kent State University, and John Carroll University. She earned a BA and MA, and studied Christian Education, Special Education, Elementary Education, and Economics.

Elaine shared her love for learning with students as an elementary school teacher for the Painesville and Chardon Schools. She has enjoyed success as a writer, authoring three books chronicling Finnish American history and is currently working on her fourth. A talented watercolor artist, she has illustrated her own books.

Elaine has raised three healthy sportsmen: Larry, Peter, and Douglas. Elaine is very proud of them, and of her husband Eugene who passed away in 1987. He served in World War II in the United States Army and was awarded three Medals of Honor, one being the Silver Star. He also served as a Math professor at Kent State University.



Adam Santee, a 1999 graduate of Perry High School, was one of Perry's finest overall athletes, excelling in both football and wrestling. In fact, he is in that extreme rare class of athletes that earned All-Ohio honors in multiple sports. As a captain for the Perry Foot-

ball team, Adam was named the team's MVP in 1998 and led the team to a CVC Championship and State Playoff appearance. He was later named to the Lake County Touchdown Club's 1st team, 1st team All-CVC and selected as an All-Ohio Wide Receiver.

As a captain for the Perry Wrestling squad, Adam was a two time All-Ohio honoree. He placed second in the state during his junior year, which ties him for the highest all-time finish in Perry Wrestling history.

Adam received an athletic and academic grant to Brown University, where he continued to excel athletically, as well as in the classroom. He was a three-year starter and letter winner for the Brown Wrestling program, also serving as a team captain during his career. Adam also was an All-Ivy League selection in wrestling and was named an Academic All-American.

Our Running Pirates are Making Great Strides

Over many decades and years, Perry High School has had a reputation for its strong cross country and track and field programs, and our 2011 track and cross country teams have been no exception. Last Spring, the girls' track and field team made Perry history by being the first team to qualify 2 relay teams to the State meet (4x400 and 4x800) and Abbie Clifford was the first Perry athlete to compete at the state meet in 4 events (4x400, 4x800, 1600, 800). This Fall our Boys' cross country proved that they were fierce competitors by qualifying as a team for the state cross country meet. The team was coached by Perry Alumni, Bill Sarvis (PHS Class of 1980) and Eric Thomas (PHS Class of 1995).

As a Perry High School athlete, Lou DiDonato coached Bill Sarvis. After Coach DiDonato's retirement, the torch was passed on to Coach Sarvis, and he has upheld the tradition of success by our running Pirates. Coach Sarvis commented, "It's great to be able to work with great student-athletes that have, I believe, represented our Perry community so well as athletes, and more importantly, as ambassadors of character and honor." We are very proud of the successes that our Alma Mater has achieved on the track and cross country course.

Bill Sarvis, Eric Thomas, and our other outstanding track and field coaches have helped prepare our Perry athletes for the next competitive level of running. Abbie Clifford (Class of 2011) is currently running at Cornell University, Marissa Baraunaskas (Class of 2010) and Dan Jackisch (Class of 2009) are running at Akron University, Rachael Greuber (Class of 2010) is running at John Carroll University, Kyle Herron (Class of 2008) is running at Lake Erie College.


