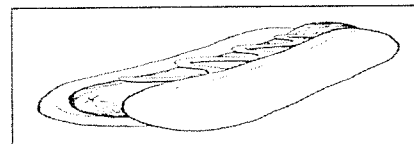
All Class Reunion

PERRY HIGH RATED AS ONE OF OUR NATION'S BEST!!

According to *US News and World Report*, Perry High School ranks 27th out of a total of 873 in Ohio. This ranking places PHS in approximately the top 3% in Ohio.

They also reported high school ranking within the country. Perry ranks 735 in the USA out of a total of 22,000 high school's placing us in the top 3% nationwide and qualifying PHS for a Silver Medal.

Information included in the *US News and World Report* included a college readiness index, math and reading proficiency ranking, student/teacher ratio, demographic information, AP participation ranking and an overview of the high school.

ROMANO AND ROMANO HOLD PHS RECORDS

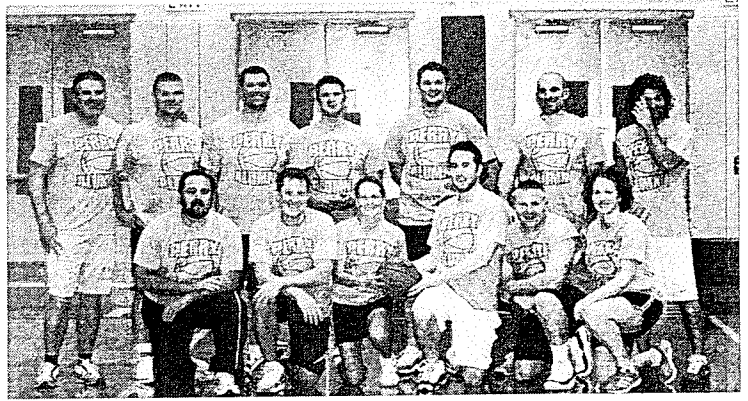

to Shanon Romano**

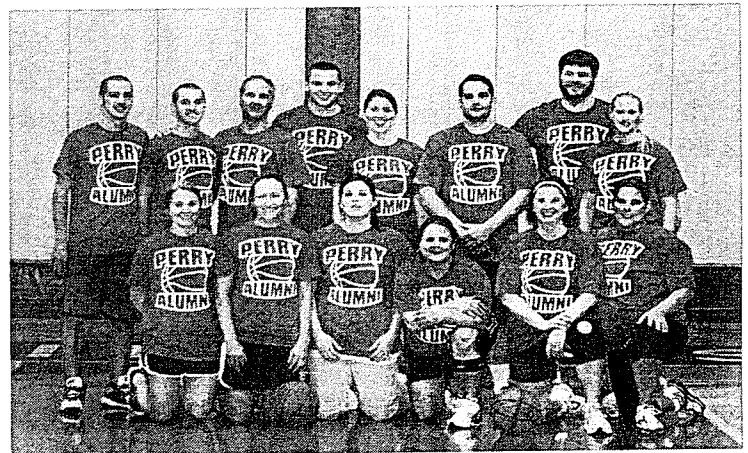
BOUNCE NIGHT

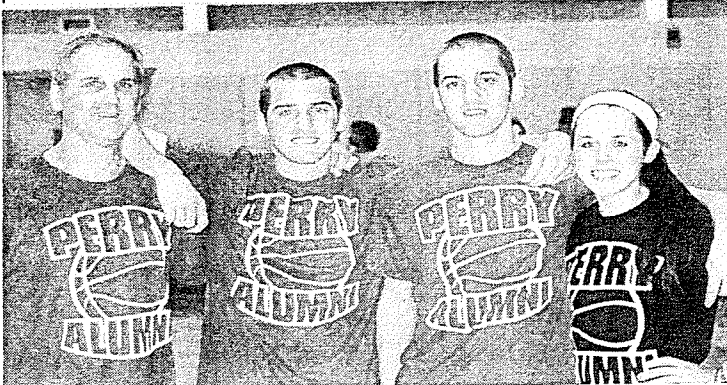

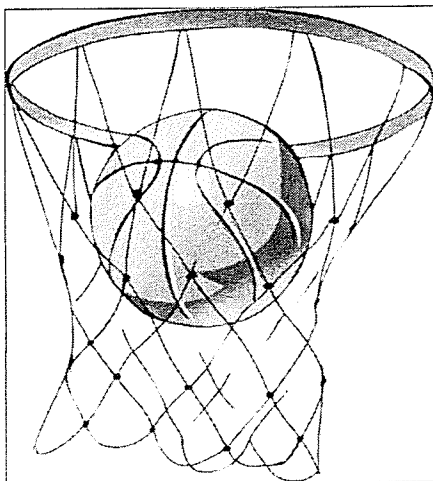

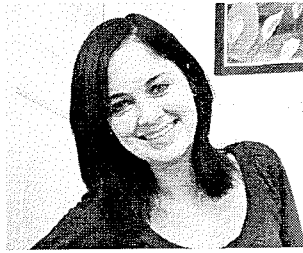

Tanya E. Parker Class of '09

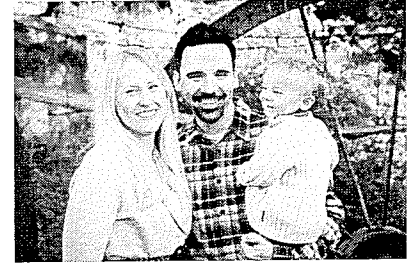

Elizabeth Schrauder Ermis Class of '00



Elizabeth Schrauder Ermis has made it her mission to become an advocate for research and funding for congenital heart disease (CHD). In April 2010, Elizabeth and her husband gave birth to a beautiful baby boy. Within an hour, they were told he had been diagnosed with a major heart defect called Tetralogy of Fallot. Since his diagnosis, he underwent open heart surgery, battled infections, and has spent several weeks in the hospital. Through Elizabeth's family experience, she has been inspired to raise awareness of this condition and fundraise for its cause through the March of Dimes—an organization that primarily focuses on premature birth, birth defects, and infant mortality. In 2011, Elizabeth reached a personal fundraising milestone by raising more than \$12,000 for the March of Dimes. She was awarded with the March of Dimes' President's Award for individual fundraising and message awareness. This year her family will be serving as the ambassador family for the Triad area March for Babies.

Additionally, Elizabeth and her family are members of the Mended Little Hearts support group—a support group for families with children with congenital heart disease. As part of her participation with that group, she traveled to Washington D.C. and spoke to the House Caucus on Congenital Heart Disease about raising a child with CHD and the importance of federal funding for research and treatment. Elizabeth and her family currently live in North Carolina, and she also has worked with North Carolina's House of Representatives and State Senators to lobby for support for the Congenital Hearts Future Act. Families who are touched by CHD are faced with a life time of care and need. Through Elizabeth's personal endeavor, she has found that the best support can come from one's communities.

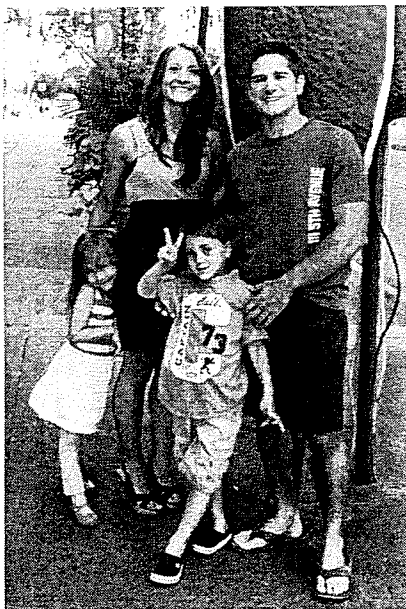

Ryan Patriarca **Class of '99**

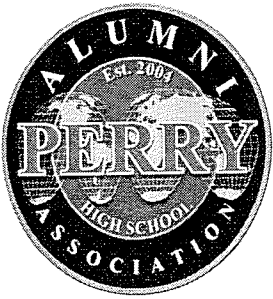
Before 2008, Ryan Patriarca had never run more than a mile at once or even dreamed of running a marathon. He has now run 6 marathons. At 26 years old Ryan decided that he needed to live a healthier lifestyle. He began dieting and working out at his home but he found this routine to be a bit mundane. He began running and he found it to be continually challenging. Ryan stated, "I like a challenge, and I found the more



goals I set and met, the more addicted I became to the sport." In the beginning, Ryan's goals were based on distance and then he became more focused on pace. After some persuasion from his wife, Ryan decided to run his first race—the Cleveland Marathon. He planned to run and raise money for St. Jude's Children Hospital in honor of his aunt who passed away from cancer at a young age. To his surprise, Ryan ran his first race with a Boston Qualifying time, which is an incredible achievement for even the most experienced runner. In 2011, Ryan ran three marathons—Rite Aid Cleveland Marathon (2:59.08), Boston Marathon (3:09.09), and Nationwide Columbus Marathon (3:00.12). Ryan's achievement of running three marathons sub-3:10 and breaking the 3-hour marathon is very impressive.

Even though Ryan did not run in high school, he has benefited from our outstanding facilities and acknowledges his time as Pirate as a positive influence. "Perry has always held a high standard for their students and this has influenced me in my life in many ways. Perry has outstanding athletic facilities. Although I didn't run in high school, I do currently use both the indoor and outdoor tracks for training." Just as Ryan found his love for running after high school, he encourages others to lace up and hit the open road. Ryan advises, "Start slow, stay short, and set a series of small goals. I would not worry about pace or even distance in the first few months. Eating healthy and getting plenty of sleep is vital to performing well. After some time when running begins to feel a bit habitual, you are ready to incorporate some speed-work in. Never take off more than two days in a row unless you are sick or injured; be consistent."
