Elisabeth Brahler Mortimer '88 Jack Melvin '71

Two Perry High School grads were recognized in September for their athletic accomplishments. Elisabeth Brahler Mortimer, Class of 1988, and Jack Melvin, Class of 1971, were inducted into the Perry High School Athletic Hall of Fame.

Elisabeth excelled in volleyball and track while at Perry High School. In volleyball, she was the team MVP, top hitter, and led the Lady Pirates in aces. She received the League and District MVP awards, and was an All-Ohio honorable mention selection. She was also the girls track team MVP her senior year and was selected as the school's top female athlete.

After a stellar high school career, Elisabeth went on to attend The Ohio State University where she participated in volleyball. After graduation, she continued to play volleyball on competitive teams and has also coached at the high school level.

Jack was an exceptional athlete who participated in three varsity sports earning eight varsity letters over the course of his high school career. While attending PHS, he ran cross country and was a three-year letter winner.

During the winter months, Jack participated in basketball earning All-League and All-Lake County honors. He was also the leading rebounder on the 1971 team.

While running track, Jack become a two-time state qualifier in pole vault, and in 1971, he finished among the top five in the state. To this day, Jack holds the school record in pole vault with a vault of 13 feet, 11-1/2 inches.

Teacher Feature: Mrs. Eleanor Baker

Perry students between the years 1957 and 1975 had the opportunity to receive instruction from an incredibly talented artist with a passion for teaching...Mrs. Eleanor Baker. Not only was she an educator, she was a refined lady, friend, mentor and role model.

Mrs. Baker received her Bachelor's degree from Kent State University in 1937, then spent two years in graduate school at The Ohio State University. "My lifelong desire was to become an artist. Realism set in during my sophomore year in college and I decided to become a teacher. It was the best decision I ever made. I loved teaching!"

She was right that teaching was her calling. "A smile and a word of encouragement is how I remember Mrs. Baker's success in getting her students to do their very best. I always felt she saw our potential and did her best to draw it out of us. Her genuine love for art and teaching showed in her enthusiasm in her class. Art was one of my favorite classes, and today it's still

something I enjoy. I know Mrs. Baker had something to do with that. I am so thankful to have had such a great teacher," said Diana Drain Matheny '74.

Mrs. Baker's Perry career began as the elementary and junior high Art teacher. After ten years on the job, she became the high school Art teacher, where she also served as the Art Club advisor until her retirement in 1975.

She has fond memories of the Art Club members' creativity, workmanship and enthusiasm as they built award-winning floats for the Cleveland Thanksgiving Parade. She also proudly remembers the Art Club members' community spirit. "They gave a lot of time outside the classroom to volunteer efforts. One organization, Delta Kappa Gamma (a teacher's society), is still using program covers that were silk-screened by our faithful students."

When asked about her most rewarding experience as a teacher in Perry, she responded, "The accomplishments of the

students." She admits, "Teachers learn a lot from their students. Many of the lessons I planned came from your creativity and your ideas."

She recalls her funniest memory, which she says was not so funny at the time: "The students had made full-size plaster mannequins and placed them in the office after it was empty for the day. The principal was aghast when he unlocked the door in the morning. He did not think it was funny!"

Does anvone remember seeing Mrs. Baker with a red nose just before Christmas vacation? In the spirit of the season, a group of teachers thought it would be funny to paint their noses red. What the teachers thought was humorous, administration did not! The teachers were reprimanded and this became one of Mrs. Baker's most embarrassing moments. She no longer had just a red nose, but a red face!

Allen Weaver '75 says, "Mrs. Baker was a wonderful person and teacher. Even though we were her students, she treated all of us as adults, as equals; she respected our individuality. I don't ever remember Mrs. Baker ever having a problem with any student as we all wanted to return her kindness and respect."

Susan Miller Finocchioli '78 adds, "She was a source of inspiration who left a



lasting impression on me, not just because of her artistic talent, but because of the fine qualities she exhibited as an individual."

Today Mrs. Baker is active in the Monday Morning Book Club in Madison, plays Bridge, enjoys luncheons and dinners with friends, and of course, paints and draws. She has been an active volunteer for both the Perry and Madison historical societies. She is a committed volunteer for the Mental Retardation/ Developmental Disabilities program at Deepwood.

The hometown girl who grew up on Main Street made her initial claim to fame as a Playboy Bunny. Dee (as she was known in high school) went on to train as a computer programmer, win six national titles in one year in the American Quarter Horse Association, earn national sales awards, travel the world, and own two Migun thermal accupressure bed stores.

She is an accomplished equestrian, winning the American Quarter Horse Amateur Association Congress in 1992 and

again in 2005, and owning the Reserve World Champion Quarter Horse.

DeDe (as she's known now), the congenial, personable and ambitious girl from the Class of 1965, says, "Looking back, I believe being a part of the Class of '65 was an honor. They were good friends and good people. I believe each person in his or her own right has been very successful." She attributes much of her success to "the people I grew up with."

One of DeDe's most embarrassing moments in high school also became one of her most valuable lessons. She was "singing in a hootenanny with Barb, Ruth and Nancy, and I had stage fright and the words wouldn't come out. After losing my voice in the song, I vowed to always be prepared on stage." This powerful lesson helped her achieve success while working as part of the largest Shaklee organization, a job that required her to lead groups and conduct presentations. This skill helped her become the number one sales leader in the Network Marketing-Shaklee Corporation, For 25 consecutive years she won trips around the world in

recognition of her significant sales efforts.

She has devoted her time and talent to fundraising for non-profit organizations, including the American Heart Association and the American Cancer Society, and has served on the board of the American Quarter Horse Amateur Association in Florida and the Masters Executive Board of the Shaklee Corporation.

DeDe calls Jensen Beach, Florida her home these days. She and husband of 35 years, George, raised a son and are now grandparents to three-year old Ella and five-year old Tyler.

When asked what she is most proud of, she responded, "My husband, our son and his family, and helping both of our parents." With pride she says, "My husband is very

successful with his business. Shaw Stallion Management. He sends our stallions to Australia and New Zealand, and owns the number one stallion in New Zealand. He has been selected Representative of the Year for Small **Business Owners** and has served on two congressional committees."

Favorite book: Elizabeth the Great by Browning. "It's amazing what women can accomplish staying focused and believing in one's self."


Favorite movie: Chariots of Fire

Alumni Association to Award Second \$500 Scholarship

The Perry High School Alumni Association Scholarship was established in 2005 to recognize a graduating senior who is the child or grandchild of a PHS alumnus and who has exhibited commitment and loyalty to his/her school and/or community.

Elibility

Candidate must:

- be a graduating senior
- be the child or grandchild of a PHS alumnus
- complete the scholarship application (below)
- plan to pursue post-secondary education immediately following graduation from high school
- possess a 2.5 or higher grade point average at time of application and provide verification
- submit an essay (see Essay Guidelines)
- submit two letters of recommendation addressed to the PHS Alumni Association Scholarship Committee: one from a high school teacher, school staff member or Perry High School alumnus, and one from any other individual

Essay Guidelines

The essay must respond to the question: What have you done to make your community and/or school a better place? The essay must be typed and contain no more than 500 words. The candidate's name, home address and home phone number must appear in the upper right corner of the essay.

Deadline

The scholarship application, letters of recommendation, grade verification and essay must be postmarked by April 1.

Notification

The scholarship recipient will be notified by May 15.



The first of the alumni engraved bricks were put in place in September. They're now part of the sidewalk leading to the home bleachers at Alumni Stadium.

If you ordered a brick and didn't find it in the walk-way, it's because our brick consultant is committed to providing exceptional service—he'll only accept the very best! If he found a brick with even the slightest imperfection, he sent it back to be replaced. Sorry if you looked for your brick and

didn't find it. We appreciate your patience as we make this project one we can all be proud of.

If you haven't already ordered a brick, it's not too late; this is an ongoing project. Bricks sold by July 15, 2006 will be added to the sidewalk prior to Homecoming.

Bricks sell for \$40 each. To order a brick, clearly print on a piece of paper the text you'd like to have appear on the brick. You have up to three lines of text

with no more than 18 characters/spaces per line. Bricks may contain the names of former Perry

students, teams, clubs or current or past Perry School faculty, coaches or administrators.
